Ramen Play launches new items

TWO years after RamenPlay started business, it has tweaked its menu.

The key dishes are still there, as expected, but there are new items that will win fans.

Of the additions, my favourite is the toroniku double soup ramen (\$16).

The double soup is a rich broth of shoyu, tonkotsu and fish oil.

It has an impactful flavour.

I enjoyed the soup so much I finished it all.

Another new item is the black sesame fried rice (\$10.80).

It uses niigata rice (Niigata is the rice capital of Japan) and aromatic black sesame.

It doesn't look promising, but once you start on it, it's hard to stop.

The fragrance of the sesame is intoxicating.

The Nabemushi tofu (\$6.80) is a twist on

chawanmushi.

A tofu mixture is poured into a heated earthen pot and it cooks right before your eyes.

It's gimmicky, but the tofu is silky smooth.

The new items will be rolled out progressively, starting from Sept 24 at 313@Somerset, Sept 27 at Nex and Sept 30 at Junction 8.

They won't be available yet at the Resorts World Sentosa branch.
